

Detention Forum Privacy Policy

The Detention Forum is a network of organisations working together to challenge the UK's use of immigration detention. In this Privacy Policy, we've provided information about when and why we collect your contact information, how we use it, and how we keep it secure.

As part of the application process for volunteers and new members, we collect your contact details, title and organisational affiliation. We may also collect your details if you ask us to add you to our mailing list.

We use this information for a few reasons:

- To share updates and promote policy and campaigning initiatives, as relevant to the agreed Theory of Change;
- To contact you if we need to obtain or provide additional information;
- To check our records are right and to check every now and then that you're happy and satisfied.

When someone visits <http://www.detentionforum.org.uk> we use a third party service, Google Analytics, to collect standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour patterns. We do this to find out things such as the number of visitors to the various parts of the site. This information is only processed in a way which does not identify anyone. We do not make, and do not allow Google to make, any attempt to find out the identities of those visiting our website.

We won't share your details outside the Detention Forum without your consent or use them for marketing purposes.

We store your information in password-protected accounts and files, and will delete it when you ask us to or you stop being a member.
